SONG ACCOMPANIMENT - DECONSTRUCTED

RHYTHM:

- Moderate 4/4: "Daba Daba" problem
- Solutions: "Camel" rhythm (deemphasize mid-bar)
 - o Left hand: Hashkiveinu
 - o Right hand (more subtle): Shalom Rav Klepper
- Melodic rhythm counterpoint
 - o Adonai, Adonai Sher
- Syncopated 1/8 "Chorale" (RH Ostinato)
 - o Dodi Li Sher
- "Chorale": Florid subdivisions
 - o L'cha Dodi Zeira
- Moderate "Ethnic": Yemenite rhythm
 - o Yismechu
 - o D'ror Yikra
- Country Pick
 - Hallelu Sufi
- <u>3/4 Problem: Waltzy</u>
- Solution: for slow tempi, create "gymnopedie" feel
 - o Shabbat HaMalka Young (also bell tone A)
- Moderate tempi, emphasize mid-bar
 - o Yedid Nefesh
- Swifter tempi, Gentle jazz waltz (soft articulation)
 Shiru l'Adoni Silver

HARMONY

- Modes (Dorian, Mixolydian, Phrygian)
 - o Phrygian: what comes to mind as "Jewish" (Avinu Malkeinu)
 - o Dorian (the Jewish Picardi): Adonai Sefatai Young, Hinei ma tov (both versions)
 - o Aeolian (natural minor)
- Substitutions to avoid repetition Pik Shma
- <u>Inversion</u> examples: Bob Remstein Shiviti, Yihyu LeRatzon Nelson
- * Talk about inversions: Like color scheme, adds several dimensions.

- <u>MELODIC BASS</u> discussion: Analyze any great piece, most will have melodic interest in the bass
- What is a lyrical line: stepwise motion, shorter length notes
- Examples from all musical genres: Mati Caspi, You'll Never Walk Alone
- My examples: using chord substitutions and inversions to create interest in the bass line Hinei ma tov, Hirsch Oseh Shalom
- Use of ostinato bass: Groundedness, depth, makes upper harmonies more transparent (like overtones). A minimalist derivative (power of minimalism)
 - o Janowski Avinu Malkeinu (Sheet music)
- My example:
 - o Eili, Eili

MELODY

- More don't's than do's
- 1/6 interval Maseng Hashkiveinu
- Clusters and suspensions Young Shabbat HaMalka intro/outro
- TEMPO Most over-diagnosed. How to communicate tempo, how to guess tempo (pianists). Trick: How to correct tempo
- VOICING and REGISTRATION more effective than dynamic adjustment (or closed lid); Demonstrate (Shma Pik)

CANTOR: Prepare sheet music, discuss changes

Listen without singing or humming, send feedback. If none, play and sing, send

feedback.

PIANIST: Play, Record, Sing, Listen, Fix, Send, Adjust.

CANTOR: Listen, Sing, Send, Practice

Tricks:

Disable the startle reflex: break chords Remstein Shiviti

Bell tones Shalom Rav Klepper Added licks Havdallah Friedman Tremolo strings on free coda
